ART: 49TH WORLD ARTISTIC GYMNASTICS CHAMPIONSHIP STUTTGART 2019

49th World Artistic Gymnastics Championship at Stuttgart has come back to Germany after 1989 and 2007 World Championships, which is a gymnastics' home, will once again host at Hanns-Martin-Schleyer Hall. 2019 World Championship taking place from 4-13th October 2019 attracting more than 540 gymnasts from a record 92 nations and will award 14 sets of medals as well as team and individual Olympic berths in the final global competition before the 2020 Olympic Games in Tokyo (JPN). The championship expects 100,000 spectators from around the world in the arena to witness the fantastic performances of the World class gymnasts. The competition will determine the winners of eight sets of medals for men (Team, All-around, Floor Exercise, Pommel Horse, Still Rings, Vault, Parallel Bars, and Horizontal Bar) and six for women (Team, All-around, Vault, Uneven Bars, Balance Beam, and Floor Exercise). The medals, designed and produced exclusively by companies in the local Baden-Wurttemberg region, took more than 2 1/2 years to create and are adorned with sustainable ribbons. Olympic qualification, which kicked off at last year's World Championships in Doha Qatar, continues in Stuttgart, where the top nine teams in each discipline will qualify to Tokyo (excluding the three already qualified by winning team medals in 2018 - People's Republic of China, Russian Federation, and Japan for the men, and the United States, Russian Federation, and People's Republic of China for the women). Additionally, individuals from countries that do not qualify teams to Tokyo have a chance to earn Olympic berths in Stuttgart. The top 12 male and top 20 female gymnasts in the All-around qualifications will qualify to Tokyo, with a maximum of one gymnast per nation in each discipline. In addition, the three highest placed eligible athletes on each apparatus from apparatus

Indian Artistic Gymnastics Contingent consists of Ashish Kumar, Aditya Rana, Yogeshwar Singh in MAG, Pranati Nayak, Pranati Das and B. Aruna Reddy in WAG along with their coaches Mr. Manoj Rana in MAG and Ms. Meenara Begum in WAG participated in 49th World Artistic Gymnastics Championship at Stuttgart Germany from 4-13th October 2019. Mr. Ashok Mishra accompanied the Indian Gymnastics Contingent as Head of Delegation-cum-Coach while Preity Dabas as Physiotherapist. Indian MAG & WAG gymnasts performed well but could not retain the score what they achieved during the selection trials held at IG Stadium New Delhi on 16th September 2019 and none of the Indian gymnast in MAG and WAG qualified for the finals. B. Aruna Das could only participate in Uneven Bars and Beam but was not able to perform on Floor and Vault due to knee injury. The average score in MAG was 12.00 points while in WAG was 11.50 points. Mr. Deepak Kabra FIG International Judge was also one of the judges at the 49th World Artistic Gymnastics Championship at Stuttgart Germany.

The Russian Federation won its first World Team title with 261.726 points on Wednesday, dethroning defending champion the People's Republic of China at 2019 World Championship in Stuttgart with Japan wearing Bronze and Russians ended 25 years of frustration since 1994 when the first team title from independent Russia took silver behind china while Olympic Champion Simone Biles powered the USA Women team to the top of the standing on Saturday seeking its 5th consecutive World Team title with 172.330 points i. e. 2014, 2015, 2016, 2018 & 2019 as there was no Team Championship in 2017 at Montreal. American Simone Biles claimed the 5th All-around Individual Championship in 2013, 2014, 2015, 2018 & 2019 with 58.999 points became the most decorated gymnast in the World Championship history when she secured a convincing victory on



Beam to overtake Belarusian Vitaly Scherbo's record tally of 23 World medals (1991-96) and also defended her floor title to win record 25th World Championship medal out of which 19 are Gold. Nagornyy Nikita Russia became the New World All-around Individual Champion with 88.772 points.

KHELO INDIA: SELECTION TRIALS FOR U/21 YEARS FOR 3RD KIYG GUWAHATI 2020

The **Gymnastics Open Selection Trials** were conducted by Sports Authority of India for 3rd Khelo India Youth Games 2020 to be held Guwahati from 10-22nd January 2020 to select the gymnasts U/21 years of age (as of 31st December 2019) in Men's and Women's Artistic Gymnastics and Rhythmic Gymnastics on 31st October and 2nd November 2019 respectively at Indira Gandhi Indoor Stadium New Delhi due to postponement of All India Inter-University Gymnastics Championship to March 2010. Gymnasts who participated or willing to participate in the 65th National School Games at Agra in the category of U/19 years of age, are not eligible to participate in the above selection trials. Total 97 men and 24 women gymnasts in the Artistic Gymnastics and 20 women gymnasts in Rhythmic Gymnastics across the country participated in the above selection trials held on 31st October and 2nd November 2019 at IG Stadium New Delhi. Approximately 8 best gymnasts on merit in MAG, WAG and RG were provisionally selected for the 3rd edition of Khelo India Youth Games which scheduled to be held at Guwahati (Assam) in January 2020.



MILITARY GAMES: 7th CISM WORLD MILITARY GAMES WUHAN, CHINA 2019

Founded on February 18th 1948, The International Military Sports Council (CISM) is the 2nd largest multi-sport disciplinary organization after the International Olympic Committee. The council organizes numerous sporting events for the armed forces of its member countries. Established with the aim of promoting sports activities and physical education between armed forces, it aims to bring together soldiers who may have previously faced each other in order to promote world peace. First World Military Games were held in Rome in 1995 where 4017 participants from 98 countries took part. Since the establishment of the World Military



Games, India has been a part of the event only three times. Beginning in 2007 when India hosted the 4th edition of World Military Games in Hyderabad in which 4738 participants from 101 countries took part. Then in 2011 at Rio and India won 6 medals in the 2015 edition at South Korea. India has sent a contingent of 54 participants belong to all the 3 wings of Indian Armed Forces who will be taking part across 9 sporting events which are; Archery, boxing, diving, modern pentathlon, shooting, track and field, gymnastics and tennis at the 7th



CISM World Military Games at Wuhan China from 18-28th October 2019 which are played every 4 years. China hosted 2019 CISM World Military Games for the very first time in which 9308 participants from 140 countries took part in 27 sports. 2019 game's slogan was "Military Glory, World Peace". Host nation China sent a delegation consisting of 553



participants for the games, which would mark the record number of participants to represent a nation at a single Military World Games. India ranks 45th in the total medal tally winning a total of 21 (2 gold, 3 silver and 16 bronze) medals in the previous editions. Russia ranks the list with 550 medals (243 gold, 174 silver and 133 bronze). India sent 4 gymnasts namely Rakesh Kumar Patra, Yogeshwar Singh, Aurik Dey and Abhijit Kumar along with their coach Mr. B. L. Bayaskar in the 7th CISM World Military Games at Wuhan China. 27 gymnasts participated from 6 countries i. e. China (6), Brazil (6), North Korea (6), India (4), Armenia (3) and Vietnam (2) and Indian Team qualified for C-IV with 281.659 points from competition no. 1. All-around Individual Champions were declared from C-I where Yogeshwar Singh and Arik Dey were placed at 7th & 8th rank with the score as shown in the table. China won gold medal with 260.294 points in Team Championship, silver medal by Brazil with 243.526, bronze medal to North Korea with 237.627 points and India remained at 4th place with 228.161 points out of 4 teams only. Arik Dey qualified for C-III in FX, TV, PB & HB, Yogeshwar Singh qualified for C-III in PH, TV & HB While Rakesh Kumar Patra qualified for C-III in RR & PB and their results may be seen in table given below

OLYMPICS LOGO: 2024 PARIS OLYMPICS AND ITS LOGO

The 2024 Summer Olympics officially known as the Games of the XXXIII Olympiad and commonly known as Paris 2024, is a forthcoming international multi-sport event that is scheduled to take place from 26 July to 11 August 2024 in Paris, France. Paris previously hosted Olympics in 1900 and 1924 and became the second city to host the Olympics three times, after London (1908, 1948 and 2012). 2024 will mark the centenary of the Paris Games of 1924. These will be the sixth Olympic Games hosted by France (three summer and three winter). The bidding process for these Games began in 2015. Five cities submitted their candidature, but Hamburg, Rome and Budapest withdrew, leaving only Paris and Los Angeles in contention. A proposal to elect the 2024 and 2028 Olympic host cities concurrently was approved by an Extraordinary IOC Session on 11 July 2017 in Lausanne. On 31 July 2017, the IOC agreed a deal that would see Paris host the Games in 2024 and Los Angeles four years later. The logo for both the 2024 Summer Olympic Games and Paralympic Games in Paris, France was unveiled late night on 21st October 2019 at Grand Rex by The Organizing Committee for the Olympic and Paralympic Games Paris 2024. For the first time, the logos for both events are identical with the exception of the Olympic rings being replaced with the **Paralympic Agitos** means "I move" encircling a central point, emphasizes the role of the Paralympic Movement in bringing athletes together from all corners of the world to compete. The Paralympic Symbol (three Agitos) consists of three elements in red, blue and green – the three colours that are most widely represented in national flags around the world. The symbol also reflects the Paralympic Motto, "Spirit in Motion" representing the strong will of every Paralympian.



The logo is made up of three symbols acknowledging both the games and the host nation of France — the Olympic / Paralympic flame, a gold medal, and the face, a representation of Marianne, a French national symbol “which embodies the revolutionary spirit that infuses the Paris Olympic and Paralympic Games”. The combination of the gold medal, the Olympic flame and Marianne brings together the values, history and French touch that will make these Olympic Games truly special.


ART: STATE KRIDA RATNA AWARD TO MR. JAIPAL REDDY 2019

He had completed the Government Certificate in General Mechanics and started Manufacturing Spare Parts of Motorbike and other spare parts in Re road, Mumbai. Later he Started used Parma Wood from The Factories of Bhiwandi and Mushatidbadar for the manufacturing of Parallel Bars and Uneven Bars at his factory at Thane, whereas he Used Foam in the manufacturing of Flex Floor. He also manufactured Kids Equipment's for Shri Pavanputra Gymnasium for first time in the Whole Country. Late Anil Pathare manufactured the Stands of the Balancing Beam and Structure of Uneven Bars that were used first time in the National Gymnastics Championship at Chandigarh in 1972 which were also new for the participants. He was also manufacturing equipment's for Mallakhamb and Rope Mallakhamb besides gymnastics equipment's. He also Created Foam Pits for INS Hamala Malad in Mumbai. He was Well Known in Chennai, Madhya Pradesh, Gujrat and Maharashtra for his quality equipment's.
