MAGA: 5th ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF MAGA VIA ZOOM APP FOR 2019-20

5th Annual General Meeting of Maharashtra Amateur Gymnastics Association (MAGA) was held first time via Zoom App on 11th October 2020 at 11.30 am due to Covid-19 Pandemic which was attended by 45 delegates of 29 affiliated District units. All the 45 members were introduced to the house who attended the AGM and the discussions on the agenda as provided was discussed.



1. Mr. Pawan Bhoir Treasurer MAGA presented the audited accounts report for FY 2019-20 and tentative budget for 2020-21 was presented in detail which was passed unanimously by the members.

2. Dr. Makrand Joshi proposed to enhance the duration of Mr. V. K. Jain Auditor for FY 2020-21 and to increase his remuneration from 15,000/- to 20,000/- pm which was also agreed and passed by the house.

3. Dr. Makrand Joshi informed the house about pending issue of affiliation of Buldana District Gymnastics Association and Jalgaon District Gymnastics Association was discussed with submission of all related documents which was granted by the EC members after discussion.

4. Mr. Pawan Bhoir brought the proposal to increase the affiliation fees district units from 1000/- to 2000/- and Entry fees of gymnasts from 500/- to 550/- which was opposed by many members and suggested to increase affiliation fees Rs. 1500/- for FY 2020-21 than Rs. 2000/- from FY 2021-22 and agreed for the increase in gymnasts entry fees to Rs. 550/- which was unanimously passed in the house.

5. Dr. Makrand Joshi proposed the Vote of Thanks and meeting ended with thanks to chair and wished for the better future of gymnastics in the state and as whole in the country.

SAI: SPORTS MINISTER INAUGURATED REVAMPED DIPLOMA AT NSNIS PATIALA

Union Minister for Youth Affairs & Sports Shri Kiren Rijju formally inaugurated the redesigned 58th Batch of Diploma Course in Sports Coaching 2020-21 at the Netaji Subhash National Institute of Sports (NSNIS) Patiala on 6th November 2020 at 5.00 pm in the presence of Shri Sandip Pradhan, Director-General Sports Authority of India, Commodore Pushpendra Garg High Performance Director SAI, Col Raj Singh Bishnoi, Senior Executive Director (Academics) SAI NSNIS Patiala, National Sports Federations, Special Invitees, faculty members and 725 athletes in 23 Games & Sports across the country in a virtual session. This is the first time that 34 elite sportspersons including Olympians have been given direct admission to the course so as to strengthen the coaching ecosystem in the country significantly. Union Minister of Youth Affairs and Sports Kiren Rijju said in his inaugural address that NSNIS Patiala is one of the premier sports institutes in the country. A diploma course from the SAI institutes gives you enormous credibility and we can proudly say that he or she is a SAI coach. The diploma course to be taken by the 58th batch is a wonderful opportunity to add lots of values to the sports ecosystem and also become established coaches. We are working to enhance the value and dignity of sportspersons and those who are connected with sports and creating better job facilities and economic well-being. There is no better platform than the Khelo India Games where athletes of these games can compete." These four disciplines, along with Yogasana, will get much-deserved attention among sports enthusiasts and youth of the country in the 4th edition of Khelo India Youth Games 2021 scheduled to be held in Haryana. Mallakhamb is well-known in Madhya Pradesh and Maharashtra as well as across the country. Thang-Ta, a Manipur martial art was not seen in recent years but now the sport will get national recognition again in Khelo India Youth Games 2021. Shri Om Prakash Bakoria Commissioner, Sports and Youth Welfare Services Pune, Maharashtra State had called the meeting on 7.12.2020 regarding 5% sports quota scheme which has to be reconstruct and update the procedure with software development for verification of certificates in the procurement of different Government and Semi Government jobs in Maharashtra. Three members of Maharashtra Olympic Association (MOA) and 34 Secretaries of different Sports Associations were present in the online meeting whose sports are included in the 5% sports quota scheme. MAGA Secretary Dr. Makarand Joshi was invited and attended this meeting. Agenda of the meeting was as follows:-

- 1) To discuss on development of soft software for published competition results organized by different sports association.*
- 2) To finalize the procedure of submitting the results in stipulated time.*

Following aspects were discussed in the meeting.

A) All Sports Associations should have their Website.

B) All Sports Associations should published their yearly competition and training schedule on their Website and it should be sent to the Commissioner, Sports and Youth Welfare Services, Pune.

C) State Government sports department should depute one observer for each State or National competition conducting by different Sports associations. All the expenses of observer should be borne by the sports department not by any State Association. At the end of competitions schedule, same day all state associations are adore to give final results to the observer, who is present over there. Other competition documents like entries, fixture, score sheet and other important documents should be submitted to the concerned District Sports officers or Deputy Director, Sports and Youth Welfare Services. All documents should be stamped & signed by the Secretary and make PDF files and uploaded on the website.

D) State Government is planning for developing a mobile base App to avail information to all Sports Departments and Sports Associations.
